Living my dream.....

When I was 7 years, old my parents took me to a flight show with paratroopers in Winner. I watched airplanes drop paratroopers from the sky with parachutes and it was then that I knew I wanted to do this someday. At 17 years old, I left for the Army, starting basic training in Ft. Ord, California. I asked a sergeant how to get into paratrooper school. He said I needed to lose 25 pounds, which I did, then enlisted in paratrooper school. I came home for a family medical emergency and had to leave. There was a real bad blizzard and I couldn't get back. The police came and I went to jail and was dis-enrolled. I was cleared and able to re-enroll. I had to wait for the next class, finished jump school, and graduated from paratrooper school. In 1949, I transferred to Ft. Bragg, N.C. The Korean War started and our outfit began training new recruits for the Korean War. We flew to Cuba for 2 weeks at Guantanamo Bay, then flew to Puerto Rico, stayed the night and went on to Viegue Island where we jumped onto this island. I had 42 successful jumps. I believe I lived my dream.....
