Her heart held an extraordinary amount of love and her family, whether blood or "adopted", were the joyful recipients of the outpouring of that love. She believed in forgiving people and would give those who hurt her a second chance, and in some cases an infinite number of chances. People she cared about and those who cared about her meant more to Taylor than any possession she might have. She had a very generous spirit and always strived to meet the needs of others before herself. She would literally spend her last penny on you if she thought she could give you something that would make you happy. Taylor liked people and had friends of all ages, but babies held a very special place in her heart. Whenever she attended an activity, she would be drawn like a magnet to any baby there and the next thing you saw was her carrying that baby all over. Her caring heart, also, led her to assist in the church where she served as an acolyte, and enjoyed helping with youth projects. She assisted on several BCU (Brotherhood of Christian Unity) projects and especially enjoyed those done at the Thunderhead Episcopal Camp in the Black Hills where she worked side by side with her Papa and his cohorts. Another church activity she enjoyed helping at was the annual Niobrara Convocations (in fact despite her poor health she insisted that her and Papa go to at least one day of this year's convocation, which they did just three days before her passing, and for the final time she assisted with the ingathering).

In the spirit world she has joined: her mom, Tonna, her aunt Susan, and her great grandparents: Bernard & Frances Halligan, Herman & Mabel Eagle, and Leroy & Gloria Sitting Bear.
